2024 Visitor



- As the tourism industry navigates recovery from the COVID-19 global pandemic, the British Columbia Regional Tourism Secretariat (BCRTS) continues to provide baseline research to support the industry as it moves forward
- Baseline visitor analysis will help the industry understand who is visiting our regions so they can plan strategically how and what visitors to attract
- Research commenced with the International market by region and country
- This report focuses on visitor analysis to Northern BC



Research Overview

- Environics Analytics (EA) is a Canadian based research firm providing information solutions for a variety of industries in both the Canadian and USA Markets
- VisitorView provides insights the tourism industry needs to understand, market and grow their business with International travellers
- Estimates are provided for the total number of trips and the number of nights spent in each province or tourism region. Unlike Domestic or USA visitation, International has only trips and nights. Not unique visitors. EA assumes because of the great distance they're coming for a trip, they're a unique visitor.
- VisitorView is based on anonymized, consent-based mobile location data. Monthly, quarterly and annual estimate data is available starting with January 2021 to allow for analysis of historical trends
- Environics is certified <u>Privacy By Design</u>. These certifications provide certainty that privacy considerations are embedded into every aspect of products and services.

Methodology

- **Trips:** Are defined as the count of traveller trips which involved spending one or more nights over the time period as part of a continuous visit to the destination.
- Nights Stayed: Is defined as the count of unique nights a domestic visitor was observed in the destination over the time period (between 6:00pm – 8:00am the following day)




International Trips and Nights To Northern BC By Year



2024 Visitor Highlights



- February 2024 saw a 209% increase compared to 2022, a 7% increase compared to 2023
- March 2024 saw a 149% increase compared to 2022, a 6% increase compared to 2023
- April 2024 saw a 60% increase compared to 2022, a -6% decrease compared to 2023



Yearly International Trips by Region Northern BC







- Asia saw a decrease of -84% in 2024 compared to 2023
- Europe saw a decrease of -91% in 2024 compared to 2023
- Oceania and other Islands saw a decrease of -91% in 2024 compared to 2023
- North, Central America and Caribbean saw a decrease of -89% in 2024 compared to 2023
- South America saw a decrease of -87% in 2024 compared to 2023
- Africa saw a decrease of -84% in 2024 compared to 2023



Yearly International Nights by Region Northern BC

- Asia saw a decrease of **-75%** in 2024 compared to 2023
- Europe saw a decrease of -85% in 2024 compared to 2023
- Oceania and other Islands saw a decrease of -88% in 2024 compared to 2023
- North, Central America and Caribbean saw a decrease of -82% in 2024 compared to 2023
- South America saw a decrease of -76% in 2024 compared to 2023
- Africa saw a decrease of -78% in 2024 compared to 2023



United Kingdom Year over Year Trips and Nights Northern BC













Switzerland Year over Year Trips and Nights Northern BC






